Five Million Pennies in Five Months! Can We Do It?



VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 7/27/15)—American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) asks churches and organizations across the United States and Puerto Rico to remember our children, especially those struggling with issues related to poverty, by raising pennies, each one representing a child whose life is limited by inadequate resources for nurture and nourishment.

The Penny Project began six years ago denomination-wide with an original goal of 14 million pennies, each penny representing a child living in poverty in the United States and Puerto Rico. 10 million pennies have been raised to date. Raising 5 million additional pennies will increase the total to 15 million, which ABHMS hopes to reach by December 15, 2015.

Since the project's inception, the number of children living in poverty in the United States and Puerto Rico has increased. "Unfortunately, 15 million more closely reflects the actual number of children in poverty in the United States and Puerto Rico," says the Rev. Lisa Harris Lee, ABHMS national coordinator of the Penny Project and Justice for Children Initiative. "That's the reason, as the project nears conclusion, our motto has become '5 million pennies in five months!' We can do this!"

More than 230 churches – many of them letting their Sunday school classes take the lead – have participated in the project since its inception, donating the money to good causes that make a difference in their communities.

Project participants and donation recipients have included the following: Community Baptist Church in Tulsa donated its Penny Project collection – totaling \$839.19 – to a local food bank; Community Baptist Church, Marion, MA, divided more than \$2,023 among two elementary schools, a transitional home for women, and an organization that donates diapers and other infant-related supplies to young mothers living in poverty; and Living Word Baptist Church, Beachwood, NJ, donated \$260 to a local food bank.

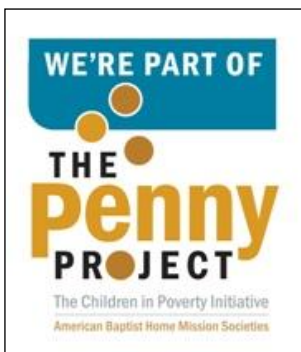
"No amount of change is too small to report," Lee says. "Every penny is a valuable representation of a child in poverty."

When I opened the camp mail there was a check to cover the balance of a camper's account. The strange thing was that the check was not for a payment for the camper the check came from; it was a payment for another camp family. These families had not met, but one felt compelled to pay the balance of the other. Stories of compassion are common at Sentinel, and they show the love of Jesus in a most generous way. They are about Christ-like living.

This past summer we explored the simple question from the Bible story in Matthew 7:24-29, "what do you build your life upon, rock or sand?" A life built upon rock is a life built on Jesus. A life built upon sand is built on a false foundation and over time the house crumbles. The Christian life is not free from challenges and storms, but when our life is built upon Christ as the cornerstone, God is our strength.

757 campers came to the grounds this past summer. Our dedicated staff team and volunteers taught them the importance of blueprint living, absolute truth, communication with God and reaching out to the world through local and global "front porch" missions.

Within the theme of "building", we took on the important challenge of increasing our dining hall space by adding 1,200 sq. feet to the Lodge. Institute for Learning News & Courses

Rev. Lillian Buckley was appointed as the Interim Director of the Institute for Learning at the August 15th meeting of the Governing Board, effective immediately. Rev. Fall Class Schedule

This fall we will be offering two courses that may be of interest to church leaders as well as IFL students. More details about the courses and course registration forms can be found on the IFL website at www.instituteforlearningvtnh.org or you can email the Institute at iflvtnh@gmail.com.

IFL 304 - Lifespan Pastoral Care will be a course about visiting people and providing a spiritual presence that will allow one to listen to them and pray for them in meaningful ways. The course will be taught by Rev. Cliff Vendt and will meet on Saturday mornings and provide information and practice time to learn about the needs of people over their lifetime and how to improve one's listening and support skills. There is also a time for 20 hours of visitation in coordination with a supervisor, like a pastor or a hospital or nursing home chaplain. Students will learn how to share their visitation experiences in class without names or identifying information so that they can discuss and learn from their experiences.

IFL 303 - Preaching and Leading Worship will be a course to help improve one's preaching skills. Students will also learn how to lead special worship services like memorial services, burials, weddings, and alternative worship services. This course will be taught by Rev. Akum Lonchar, who is currently working on her doctorate in Homiletics at the Graduate Theological Institute, Berkeley, CA. The class will meet on 5 Saturday mornings.

Protecting the Flock (& the Shepherds) Legal Seminar

Friday, September 25 from 8:30 to 1:00 at the Holiday Inn, Concord, NH.

Who should attend? Pastors, administrators, preschool teachers in child-care centers, children's ministry workers, Sunday school teachers, and counselors.

This seminar will cover mandatory reporting laws in New Hampshire (for child abuse, duty to warn, elder abuse, sexual misconduct, and criminal acts) and personnel risk mitigation (background checks and screening, supervision, retention, references for prior employees, and negligence). There will be a time for discussion of hot topics and questions. The seminar will end with lunch.

Participants will receive a comprehensive guide of all the mandatory reporting laws in the State of New Hampshire, written materials from the presenters on each topic covered with practical tips and considerations, and examples of proper and improper action based on real court cases.

Speakers: Roy McCandless and Neil Nicholson, Attorneys at Law. Both are trial attorneys & legal advisors. They work along churches, religious youth camps, and nonprofits to help them fulfill their missions, navigate risks, deal with local authorities and the IRS, and avoid problems.
