Looking back... Romania '07

In July of 2007, five members of our Presbytery representing Exeter, Portsmouth and St. Albans travelled to Romania for a one week missions trip. They spent half of that week in the city of Arad, visiting with Ovi and Doina Martin of Romanian Christian Enterprises (RCE). Ovi, a big bear of a man with a big heart, his wife Doina and many other Romanians pour their hearts and lives into this unique organization. It is unique because it is run by Romanians, but funded by Americans, with a twelve member American board to oversee operations.

God working through RCE

The Presbytery members visited fifteen families that have been touched by God and RCE over the years. Some have adopted special needs children from RCE's cottages (where more than 30 special needs children are waiting for a family to adopt them). Some have received microloans to start a business or simply buy firewood for the winter.

Some have received pigs or other meat and milk producing animals to feed their families. And some have had their houses fixed up with a new roof, a strengthened wall, a new bathroom or a kitchen, all in the name of Jesus Christ.

Ways to get involved

There are several ways you can help out. The primary focus of RCE is the special needs orphans and finding Romanian Christian families to adopt them. Please pray during Sunday school each week for God to raise up families for them (if you would like a list of the children's names, please contact us). RCE also has an alternative Christmas giving program designed so that you can buy animals, firewood and other items for RCE's families in need. Or you can join the team from NNEP going over to Romania in May to help rehab one of the poor family dwellings. Please pray about joining the team and let us know if you are interested. Where: Arad, Romania

Destination: Romanian Christian Enterprises (RCE)

Duration: 1 week- 10 days maximum

Who: 8-10 members of the NNEP including at least one teaching or ruling elder for spiritual guidance of the group. Teens older than 12 are welcome to participate along with a parent

Purpose:

- 1) To rehab or work on a "Love House" or poor family dwelling for one of the families associated with RCE
- 2) To further and deepen relationships begun in July 2007 between RCE and NNEP
- 3) To give willing NNEP members the opportunity to participate in a ministry of mercy in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord
- 4) To awaken the NNEP to the needs of the orphans and poor in Romania

Cost: Airfare (approximately \$1000) plus \$500 which goes toward food/lodging and the project itself (a typical project costs \$5-7,000)

Schedule: 5 working days with 1 day to worship and 1 day to visit families

Lodging: In the homes of RCE workers
